ONLY 4 CREDIT HOURS WILL BE AWARDED FOR EACH REQUIRED MATH COURSE. AN AVERAGE OF AT LEAST A GRADE OF "C" MUST BE EARNED IN ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES I AND ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES II.
